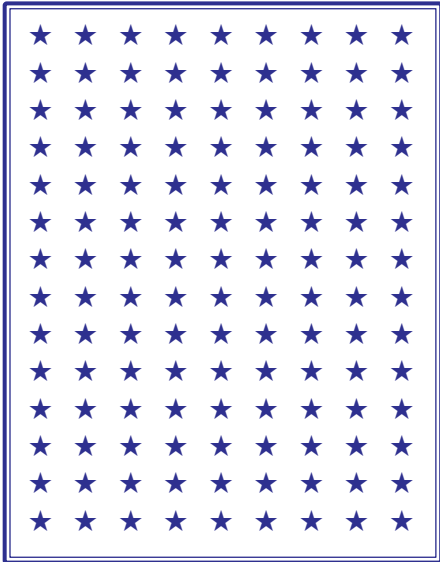

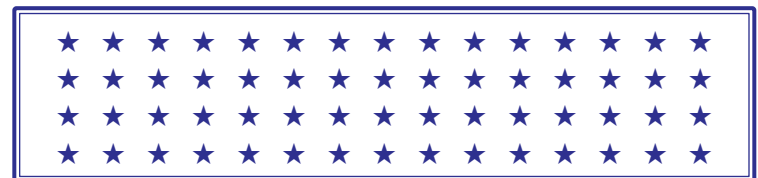

DEFINITION OF GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

5 NYCRR §142.8 - Contractor's good faith efforts

A. The contractor must document its good faith efforts toward meeting certified minority- and women-owned business enterprise utilization plans by providing, at a minimum:
