DEFINITION OF GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

5 NYCRR §142.8 - Contractor's good faith efforts

- (a) The contractor must document its good faith efforts toward meeting certified minority- and women-owned business enterprise utilization plans by providing, at a minimum:
 - (1) Copies of any solicitations of certified minority- and/or women-owned business enterprises listed in the New York State Directory of certified businesses, and any responses thereto;
 - (2) If responses to the contractor's solicitations were received, but a certified minority- or woman-owned business enterprise was not selected, the specific reasons that such enterprise was not selected;
 - (3) Copies of any advertisements for participation by certified minority- and women-owned business enterprises timely published in appropriate general circulation, trade and minority- or women-oriented publications, together with the listing(s) and date(s) of the publication of such advertisements;
 - (4) The dates of attendance at any pre-bid, pre-award, or other meetings, if any, scheduled by the State agency awarding the State contract, with certified minority- and women-owned business enterprises which the State agency determined were capable of performing the State contract scope of work for the purpose of fulfilling the contract participation goals;
 - (5) Information describing the specific steps undertaken to reasonably structure the contract scope of work for the purpose of subcontracting with, or obtaining supplies from, certified minority- and women-owned business enterprises.
- (b) In addition to the information provided by the contractor in paragraph (a) above, the State agency may also consider the following to determine whether the contractor has demonstrated good faith efforts:
 - (1) whether the contractor submitted an alternative utilization plan consistent with the subcontract or supplier opportunities in the contract;
 - (2) the number of certified minority- and women-owned business enterprises in the region listed in the directory of certified businesses that could, in the judgment of the State agency, perform work required by the State contract scope of work;
 - (3) The actions taken by the contractor to contact and assess the ability of certified minority- and women-owned business enterprises located outside of the region in which the State contract scope of work is to be performed to participate on the State contract;
 - (4) whether the contractor provided relevant plans, specifications or terms and conditions to certified minority- and women-owned business enterprises sufficiently in advance to enable them to prepare an informed response to a contractor request for participation as a subcontractor or supplier;
 - (5) the terms and conditions of any subcontract or provision of suppliers offered to certified minority- or women-owned business enterprises and a comparison of such terms and conditions with those offered in the ordinary course of the contractor's business and to other subcontractors or suppliers of the contractor;
 - (6) whether the contractor offered to make up any inability to comply with the certified minority- and women-owned business enterprises goals in the subject State contract in other State contracts being performed or awarded to the contractor; and
 - (7) any other information that is relevant or appropriate to determining whether the contractor has demonstrated a good faith effort.

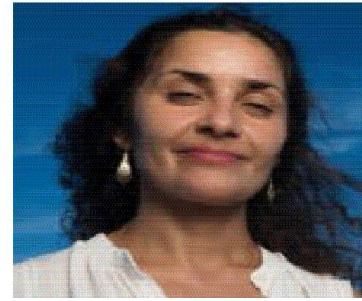

As reported by Our World in Data, global carbon emissions have quadrupled since the 1960s. With increasing economic advantages granting more individuals access to air travel, decarbonizing this sector remains one of the most challenging endeavors.

In pursuit of combating this, Dr. Anita Sengupta—a rocket scientist, doctor of electric propulsion systems for spacecraft, former NASA aerospace engineer, and commercial pilot—has established Hydroplane Limited. This dedicated team of scientists are focused on developing a modular Hydrogen Fuel Cell Power Plant for General Aviation. Their aim is to facilitate a complete transition of the aircraft market to hydrogen power, ultimately reducing CO2 emissions by over 50 billion tons by 2050.

“Hydrogen fuel cells can provide you with stored electrical energy for any use case,” Dr. Sengupta says. “It can be an alternative to diesel generators on the ground, an alternative to propulsion in a boat, for a car, for a truck.”

Founded in 2020 at the height of the pandemic, Hydroplane successfully developed its inaugural hydrogen fuel cell within a mere 18 months. The company's proficiency has been consistently recognized, culminating in the recent accolade of the Minority Emerging Technology and Industries Firm of the Year Award from the U.S. Department of Commerce, the highest level of national recognition that a U.S. minority business enterprise can receive from the Department of Commerce.

“It's fantastic and amazing to be acknowledged on the federal scale,” Dr. Sengupta says. “One of the reasons why I became an entrepreneur is because there just weren't enough women and minorities doing this. It's important to be acknowledged in that way and I was very thankful for it.”

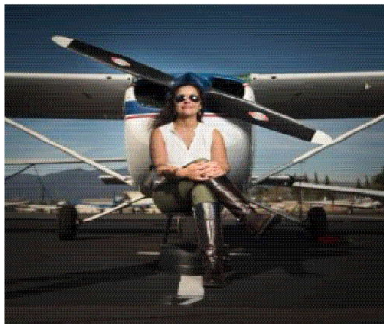
For Dr. Sengupta, prioritizing diversity when forming her team of engineers was key to Hydroplane being as successful as it is. Working within a white male dominated space, she wanted her company to reflect the demographics of the society we live in.

“We're a very diverse team in terms of ethnic backgrounds and the other agendas being represented,” Dr. Sengupta says. “I think that's also really important for the business community to have diversity because diversity of people leads to diversity of solutions.”

Additionally, in January, Hydroplane

secured two research and development contracts from the U.S. Air Force's Agility Prime program to advance its hydrogen fuel cell power plant for ground power applications.

Hydroplane is committed to developing dual use technology for both commercial and governmental use. The company is making significant strides and has even created their own aircraft powered entirely by hydrogen called Protium, which they plan on using for a flight demonstration in the summer.

"We're also in the Army xTech Aid Search 8 competition, where we're proposing an even larger version of our power plants for helicopters, auxiliary power units, and even larger ground power," Dr. Sengupta says.

Tech competitions facilitate the collaboration between small businesses and experts from the Army and Department of Defense (DoD) to address the Army's most pressing challenges. Participants vie for cash rewards and the opportunity for subsequent contracts to expedite the integration of their innovative technology solutions into the Army. The team has successfully progressed through the initial round and is presently at the pitching phase of the competition.

Dr. Sengupta's passion for decarbonizing our air and ultimately saving the planet comes from her concern of our global climate over the course of her life and

says it should be everyone's "number one priority."

"We can use public transportation or carpool, if you're going a really short distance—ride the bicycle or walk; there are so many ways that as an individual, you can reduce your carbon footprint and none of them require you to go off and buy a Tesla," Dr. Sengupta says. "I'm vegetarian, I ride my bicycle everywhere. I use public transportation when I can and, obviously, I've created a company whose goal is to turn hydrocarbons into lithium ion batteries. We have to find solutions for green energy sources because we have to protect our planet."

Although gaining profit is key to growing a business, it's not Dr. Sengupta's main priority. The doctor is on a mission to create a product that can be used by anyone and everyone regardless of their economic background. When starting her business, her desire in becoming an entrepreneur was about showing that you can have a mission prioritizing the protection of our environment and still be a strong competitor within the market.

"I believe that your business philosophy should be about helping people by creating technology that solves problems. I would say that's who we are, we are about creating a technology that will help everybody across the world, regardless of your income level and where you live by decarbonizing your energy storage," Dr. Sengupta says.
